RIP GOOCH, BLACK AVIATORS EXHIBIT

Some of Rip Gooch's family members and descendants doing the ribbon cutting ceremony to open the exhibit. I was fortunate to have known Rip personally and had several conversations with him. He signed his book, Black Horizons, for me. I treasure it.

May 19th, 2023 marked the grand opening of another Kansas Aviation Museum exhibit, this one featuring "Rip" Gooch. It is called The Black Aviator's exhibit. It recognizes two local men and their significant contributions to aviation and the community. It also recognizes the contributions of other black aviators.

Ulysses Lee "Rip" Gooch served in the Army, was a State Senator, City Councilman, KAM Board Member, equal rights promoter, and Mooney Aircraft sales office and Fixed Base Operator. Colonel John Boyd was a USAF fighter pilot and Pentagon consultant. He was influential in military, business and litigation strategies and planning.

The exhibit honors the contributions black aviators made during WWII, most of whom graduated from the Tuskegee, Alabama training program and their 332nd Fighter Squadron became known as the Red Tails. They were both fighter and bomber escorts in North Africa, Sicily, and Italy.



AMELIA EARHART HANGAR MUSEUM

Attention fellow pilots! A new item to put on your "bucket list" just popped up on the G1000. It's the Amelia Earhart Hangar Museum located at the Amelia Earhart Memorial Airport (K59) in Atchison, Kansas.

According to the Visitor Guide brochure: "With its rare blend of history and STEM exhibits, the museum offers a highly interactive and inspiring learning experience for scholars of all ages. Each exhibit is carefully outfitted to meet National Curriculum Standards, Kansas Curriculum Content Standards, and Missouri Standards of Learning."

In short, it is a fabulously high tech, interactive, meaningful, and sentimental place to enjoy some Kansas aviation history.

As part of my recent road trip vacation, this was a "must see" attraction especially so because it was only

a few miles off of my main route. All of us know bits and pieces of the Amelia Earhart story that we have gathered over the years, the museum puts much of that together in a most technologically appropriate way.

Upon climbing the stairs leading to the building we come face to face, with a beautiful bronze statue of Amelia sculpted by the brothers Mark and George Lundeen. A "twin" statue stands in the National Statuary Hall at the U.S. Capitol in Washington, D.C. The Atchison Amelia Earhart Foundation is the sole funder of the statues.

The larger than life statue embodies the stance and



character of Amelia as she appears to be standing at an airfield anticipating going flying. Her hat, goggles, and leather jacket, are on, and her scarf is already billowing from her plane's propwash.

After paying the admission fee of \$8; Child, \$12; Senior/Veteran, \$15; Adult,



in the lobby, visitors are directed to view a five minute introduction by "Amelia" via Artificial Intelligence. Having never viewed an A.I. in person, this was captivating, I was in awe. It mimicked her body motions, facial expressions, head cant, voice cadence, tone and inflection. It was an uncanny experience!



Passing through the museum's double doors. one is almost "run over" by the beautifully 1935 restored Electra 10-E sporting twin Pratt & Whitney WASP 1340 engines.

Amelia's younger sister, the plane was Lockheed's first all-metal, low-wing, dual-engine monoplane. This Lockeed was the second of only 14 built, and the only remaining version in existence. A private recreational woman pilot spent 30+ years restoring the plane to its highly polished flyable condition. Its last flying mission was as a jump plane used by the Zephyrhills


Parachute Center in Florida.


Two interactive displays are operating examples of how each engine works. Pressing a button causes each engine to operate along with producing their unique sounds.

Interactive displays such as the radial engine part identification that responds to the touch and the holograms tracing the history of flight from gliders to space travel are easily understood by the viewer. Other such interactive displays include riveting sheet metal, using a sextant for navigation, reading an electronic version of Amelia's scrapbook, and packing luggage for the trip.









This mural postcard by John Cerney (www.johncerney.com) aptly conveys the feeling that truly, Amelia did come home. It is a fitting way to end this article and to put her plane back in the hangar.

Now, make the trip to Atchison and complete one more flight that's on your bucket list, it will be worth the effort. Make it part of a vacation or a destination all by itself.

Mid-America Air Museum By Bob Immell, Director



Before I announce this month's featured airplane, first a few trivia questions. Can you name a military jet that came in at a significantly lower price than the Navy's specifications called for, and was half the maximum weight in the specifications, which set a world speed record, and could carry a bomb payload equal to a WWII B-17 Flying Fortress? If you guessed the Douglas A-4 Skyhawk, you are correct. The Skyhawk was Douglas Aircraft's legendary engineer and designer Ed Heinemann's answer to a Navy & Marine Corps specification for a light jet attack aircraft to replace the Douglas A-1 Skyraider in the early 1950s. It had many nicknames such as the Tinker Toy Jet, the Mighty Mite, the Bantam bomber, and of course Heinemann's Hot Rod. Perhaps the most common nickname for the plane however was "Scooter."

The maximum takeoff weight of the aircraft was 24,500 lbs., and about half of that weight could be weapons and ordinance of various kinds such as cannons, bombs, rockets, missiles, etc. The aircraft made its first flight in June 1954 and was introduced into service in October 1956. A total of 2,960 were built in over 20 different versions from 1954 to 1979. The US Navy began pulling A-4s from frontline attack squadrons in 1967 and the last in 1976. The Marines continued to take delivery of A-4s until 1979 and used them until the mid-1980s when they started replacing them with the Harrier Jump Jet and the last Marine Skyhawk was decommissioned in 1994. As recently as 2022, a few were still in service with both the Argentina Air Force and in Brazil. The Skyhawk had many "firsts" such as setting a world speed record of 695 miles per hour on October 15, 1955. It was the first aircraft deployed outside of the United States armed with the AIM-9 Sidewinder missile in 1956. It pioneered the "buddy system" for air to air refueling of aircraft of the same type. More on this aspect later on. In the Vietnam war it logged more combat missions than any other naval aircraft. While 195 A-4s were lost to enemy action in the Vietnam War, only one was shot down in air to air combat. Besides being an excellent attack aircraft, the plane was extremely maneuverable when not loaded down with a lot of ordinance and extra fuel tanks which made the plane an excellent stand in for the MiG 17 in aggressor training squadrons such as the Navy's Fighter Weapons School better known as Top Gun. The aircraft were also used by the Navy's Blue An-June 2023—page 11

gels for many years and for the Naval Reserve's Aerial Demonstration Team known as the Air Barons. More on the Air Barons later on. The Skyhawk was also the first US warplane exported to Israel who was the largest export customer (Skyhawks cost only 1/4 as much as an F-4 Phantom but carried ½ of the payload of a Phantom).


Specifications:

- The Navy's specifications were for a maximum cost not to exceed \$1,000,000. The average cost of the first 500 produced was \$860,000.
 - Length is 40 feet 1.5 inches.
 - Wingspan is 27 feet 6 inches.
 - Height is 15 feet 2 inches.
 - Wing Area is 260 square feet.
 - Empty Weight is 9,853 lbs.
 - Gross Weight is 16,216 lbs.
 - Max Take Off Weight 24,500 lbs.
 - Max Speed 673 mph at sea level.
 - Range 1,160 miles
- Positive G-Limit of 8 G's and Negative G-Limit of -3 G's.
 - Rate of Climb of Climb 5,750 feet per minute.
 - 5 hard Points with a capacity of 8,500 pounds.
- APG-53 Radar with a range of about 20 miles with both air-to-air and air-to-ground capabilities.
- Single Wright J65 turbojet engine in the early versions and a single Pratt & Whitney J52 in later versions.
- Two 20mm cannons with 100 rounds each in early versions and 200 rounds each in later versions.
- I have been told it had a 60 to 80 knot take off speed on runways, and a catapult shot speed of 140 to 160 knots.
- Free Moving Slats. Gravity would allow them to drop at speeds of less than 200 knots and airspeed would hold them up at speeds greater than that.
- Landing Gear that could be dropped using gravity alone if hydraulics were damaged.
 - Both Spoilers and Spilt Flaps.
- One-Piece Wing, Two Piece Fuselage Assembly.

Now for some unique history pertaining to our actual Skyhawk tail number 9635. As previously mentioned, the Naval Reserve had an aerial demonstration team called the Air Barons from 1958 to 1971. The A-4 was the aircraft used for most of this time and Skyhawk Tail Number 9635 was plane #3 of the 6-plane team. The Air Barons performed a 30-minute aerobatic demonstration all while carrying two external fuel tanks. A part of their demonstration included an aerial buddy to buddy refueling by two Skyhawks in addition to normal aerobatic maneuvers. The team consisted entirely of Naval Reserve Airmen and were not active duty servicemen like the Blue Angels. They performed to over 10 million people during their tenure. The Air Barons Naval Reserve Pilots consisted of airline pilots, one school teacher, one financial expert, and believe it or not the Art Director for Playboy Magazine. For 10 years plane number 3 was piloted by Richard Melvin Brent who had flown over 200 com-

bat missions in Vietnam, and later flew as a Captain for American Airlines for about 30 years. He passed away in an aircraft crash outside Boulder, Colorado on September 17, 2000. The plane has been on loan from the National Museum of Naval Aviation since Oc-

tober 5, 1988. The plane was trucked to the Museum by Frank Young, Joe Kraft, Lance Hawthorn, & John Schmidt. The plane is currently inside our Restoration Area of the Museum where it awaits a new paint job.
